

RESOLUTION NO. 2143-14

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WINTER PARK
RENAMING FLEET PEEPLES PARK TO ITS ORIGINAL
NAME, LAKE BALDWIN PARK

WHEREAS, on May 8, 1972, 10 acres of Lake Baldwin Park was transferred from the Federal government to the City of Winter Park as part of President Richard Nixon's "Legacy of Parks" initiative, and

WHEREAS, the remaining 13 acres of Lake Baldwin Park was officially transferred to the city on November 2, 1972, by William D. Rogers, as Bishop of the Diocese of Orlando, and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 1974, the City of Winter Park received a Federal grant from the Department of Natural Resources Division of Recreation & Parks to develop the land to usable recreation space, and

WHEREAS, on May 14, 1985, Resolution No. 1423 was adopted renaming Lake Baldwin Park to Fleet Peeples Park in honor of Fleetwood Peeples, Sr., and

WHEREAS, recent media coverage reported several alleged acts of inappropriate behavior during the 1950s, '60s and '70s, by Fleetwood Peeples, Sr., and


WHEREAS, because of the severity of the allegations and out respect for all victims of sexual abuse,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Commission of the City of Winter Park, Orange County, Florida, renames Fleet Peeples Park back to its original name, Lake Baldwin Park.

Section 1. Resolution No. 1423 is hereby repealed.


Section 2. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
