- The Chair will recognize the Board members for discussion of the motion. Any Board member may address a question to the sponsor, to the department staff or to a citizen if appropriate;
- Once there is no further discussion, or if the Question has been called (debated and voted affirmative), then the Chair will request the Board moves to a vote.

c) Ward Park-Perth/Loch Lomond Recreation Trail

Lena Peterson, the City's construction and grant manager, presented a proposal to apply for a grant through Depart of Environment of Protections. This would be in partnership with the Winter Park health foundation. The trail will connect to the existing fitness loops, and already existing trail and the future St. Andrews trail. The trail will be .91 miles. The total project is estimated at \$250,000.

The Board has some concern with the portion of the trail that travels between the baseballs fields, due to the amount of spectators at the baseball games. There is concern with cyclist, or heavy traffic during the games because people would be sitting in that area watching baseball games. It is recommended that the trail will travel around the fields instead of in between the fields.



Objective

To replicate the Gemütlichkeit (a feeling of well-being while surrounded by good food, drink, and friends and family) we provide on a daily basis at our restaurant for the Winter Park Oktoberfest event on Sunday Oktober, 1st. In addition to providing an authentic German Oktoberfest, we look forward to raising funds for Never Stand Alone.

Our Experience, and Experience

We are a family owned German Restaurant in Sanford, Florida. We have been in business for over 15 years and have won over 100 awards, including Best German Restaurant from Orlando Sentinel 12 years in a row and Best Restaurant in Seminole County. We started with just 50 seats and have grown our business to over 300, and now also operate a German market and a Trachten Clothing store. We currently have a staff of over 100 employees, most of whom stay with us an average of over 3 years.

Our traditional German experience is based on the Hollerbach family's heritage and owner Theo Hollerbach's time in Germany when he was a child. At the restaurant, we offer full plates of classic German fare, large German beers, and live entertainment provided by Jimmy Horzen. Jimmy is a top notch accordion player who, along with his partner Eckhard Wachsmuth, helps us turn our daytime café into a full-on German beer hall at night.

For the past ten years, Hollerbach's has teamed up with the Sanford Welcome Center to provide an annual Oktoberfest street party for their Thursday night event Alive After 5, paying homage to Oktoberfest in Munich, the world's largest Volksfest. For our last Oktoberfest in 2016, we were able to expand to a second day and focus on our own brand. We consider the event a huge success and have decided to expand to 3 days for 2017, as well as hold a Springfest in May.

Gemutlichkeit is the very heart of any Oktoberfest event, and we would love to implement our successful Oktoberfest strategies to create a festive, memorable experience your guests will talk about for years to come. This will include an event space reminiscent of a true German Volksfest with long, communal gasthaus tables, where guests can enjoy steaming bratwurst and kraut while toasting new friends to the sounds of traditional German music. Food tents and stalls will serve a selection of our most popular menu items, from our famous Bavarian Pretzel to delicious Apfel Strudel, and our Bier Truck will offer some of our guests' favorite brews imported from Germany. Guests are invited to sing along, dance together, and say "Prost" as our interactive entertainment fills the afternoon with music and laughter.


To kick off the event, we have made arrangements with the Willow Tree Café haus band. Jimmy Horzen and Eckhard Wachsmuth of Stuttgart, Germany provide an evening of traditional German folk entertainment complete with singing, yodeling, and folk instruments. Accordionist Jimmy Horzen sings and plays button/diatonic and piano accordions. Eckhard joins in the fun with vocals, yodeling, the Alpine Horn, Singing Saw, Alpine Bells, Soup Spoons, Musical Schnitzel Baster, and the Wooden Laughter (also known as the Holzanes G'lachter). It's an evening you won't forget with sing-alongs, the traditional "Ein Prosit" toast, the birdie dance, audience participation, comedy, polkas, waltzes, and more (did somebody say "Sweet Caroline"? "Country Roads"?). Whether you want a show, dance music, or both, call on Jimmy and Eckhard for a memorable evening of Gemütlichkeit (good cheer, fun, and atmosphere). Larger ensembles available.

Sonnenschein Express 4pm to 7pm

After a brief intermission, Sonnenshine Express will take the stage. Sonnenshine Express is an alpine/Oktoberfest band out of Orlando, Florida, hence the name Sonnenschein ("sunshine") Express. The band was founded in 1989 by Martin Gross as a recording project and has played at select engagements, conventions and festivals (including Hollerbach's Oktoberfest 2016). They showcase traditional folk songs and instruments found in the Alpine region. Crowd participation is a big part of the performance, so be prepared!

Marketing


In addition to our onsite services, we have a full event marketing program.
