Meeting called to order

The meeting was called to order at 12:07 pm. A quorum was present.

Action

a. Art in Chamber update

Staff provided a brief overview of the art installation in the Commission Chamber including the name of the artist and those who assisted in the installation of pieces. The piece will be on display in the Chamber for one year.

New Business

a. I-4 Art Endowment Introduction

Ms. Hayes informed the Board that the City has been approved for a \$150,000.00 grant for art installation around I-4. Board inquired about the Skycraft shop and its iconic space ship outside of their store. Different exit options were discussed and Staff advised that management may be able to provide some guidance as to what direction they may want to go with artwork selection.

b. Art and Culture Alliance Update

Staff advised that the alliance is holding a strategic planning event at the Advent Health Innovation Center on September 11, 2019. The goal would be to decide where they would like the alliance to go now that there is an alliance and there has been some awareness building. Members of Public Art Advisory Board will be invited to attend. A decision will need to be made on who shall attend to represent the Board. The alliance meetings will be held the first Thursday each month at 9:00 a.m. Staff also spoke

about the Dorothy Gillespie collection that was discussed about being installed in the downtown area. Staff informed the Board that the decision not to move forward with the installation was made due there being were too many moving parts to complete an install and the project lacked support and cooperation of the foundation. Board inquired if the City had agreed to provide funding support to Public Art. Staff advised that the Public Art Advisory Board had been asked to review and rank the library pieces for future placement at the new canopy location.
