## RE: Request for Funding for United Arts of Central for FY22

Thank you again for the City of Winter Park's FY21 contribution of \$17,000 to United Arts of Central Florida. United Arts is organized and operated exclusively for cultural and educational purposes in order to further programs in the arts, sciences and humanities in Lake, Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties. Funding from the City of Winter Park supports United Arts' efforts to enrich the lives of Winter Park residents and visitors by supporting a diverse, stable arts and cultural environment for residents and visitors to live, work and play.

On behalf of United Arts, I respectfully request that the City of Winter Park continue its funding of United Arts in the amount of \$17,000 for FY22. This request is based on funding for the arts at 56 cents per capita using the 2020 BEBR census population figure of 30,630 as the working number for the City of Winter Park's population.

United Arts is grateful for our long-standing partnership with the City of Winter Park. The financial support the City provides is crucial to the success of local arts and culture and we are grateful for your ongoing commitment to the organizations that call Winter Park home. The last 18-months have seen unprecedented loss of revenue and wages for our arts community and the residents who make their living in the creative industries. The City's support of United Arts, coupled with the support of other local governments, corporations, foundations and individuals, has ensured that United Arts was able to continue providing stabilizing support for Winter Park organizations throughout the pandemic. Grant awards to Winter Park organizations included:

- \$251,800 in Operating Support grants to 7 organizations
- \$80,013 in Venue Subsidy Grants to 4 organizations
- \$5,000 in Diversity in the Arts contract for service opportunities for organizations led by people of color to one organization

In addition, four Winter Park organizations participated in United Arts' annual *Collaborative Campaign for the Arts* this year, raising \$350,087 in much-needed support. United Arts is matching these funds raised at 15%, infusing an additional \$52,513 into the Winter Park arts community.
