DEBRIS PICKUP UPDATE*

October 25, 2022

All debris pickup crews have completed their first pass of collecting loose, containerized and bagged debris throughout the city. The last/final pass of debris pick up begins **Wednesday, October 26**.

Residents must place all vegetative debris and construction/demolition materials on the curb for the last pass/final collection beginning October 26. Please **DO NOT** place debris near or on trees, poles, hydrants, meters or other structures. In addition, **DO NOT** place debris in the street or block storm drains, manhole covers, or gutters.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS ABOUT THE LAST PASS

- Any new/green debris placed on top of hurricane debris will result in your pile not being picked up. Green debris will contaminate the debris piles and disqualify that volume from FEMA reimbursement.
- No furniture will be picked up. Residents must arrange for a special [Waste Pro bulk pickup](#) or dispose of furniture during the [Fall Cleanup](#) scheduled in November.
- Any debris left after the last pass must be bagged, bundled or containerized for pick up on your regular yard waste day.
- Limited resources, following FEMA protocol for reimbursement and long wait times at the landfills are still factors that impact debris collection time.
- Due to these factors, it is **expected to take 2-3 weeks for the last pass removal** of hurricane debris

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as the city continues to recover from the impact of Hurricane Ian.
