

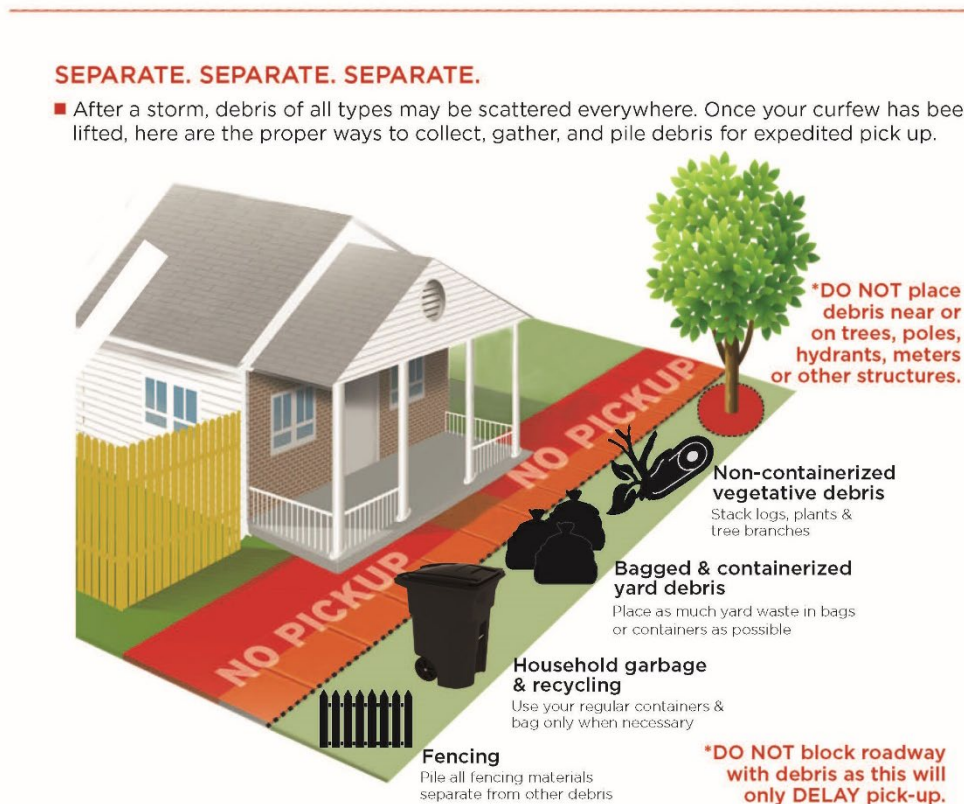

Winter Park storm information

DEBRIS PICK UP

As you continue to clean your property of debris, please **DO NOT** place your debris piles in the street. The city is sending out street sweeping crews and the equipment can only pick up small material such as sand and individual leaves with no branches. If piles of debris are in the street, the crews cannot do their work and it is also a safety hazard for vehicular traffic. The image below shows the proper placement for your debris piles that will create a safer, quicker and more efficient pickup.

- Debris pickup will begin Wednesday, October 5, but depending on volume, all debris could take a few weeks to clear.
- Waste Pro® will pick up debris in containers, bagged, bundled or tied and does not exceed three cubic yards.
- Any debris that does not fit in a bag or container such as fencing or large vegetative debris, please pile separately along the curb for city and contract crews to pick up.
- **DO NOT** place debris near or on trees, poles, hydrants, meters or other structures.
- **DO NOT** place debris in the street or block storm drains, manhole covers, or gutters.

DEPENDING ON THE SEVERITY

For weather events that result in significant property damage, please place these items in **SEPARATE** piles at curbside for pick up, as determined by the city:

- construction or demolition debris
- major household appliances
- electronics & computers
- household hazardous waste
