William P. Duval DAR Chapter donates Liberty Tree in Winter Park, FL to celebrate America 250

*Dedication ceremony is on Florida Arbor Day, Friday January 16, 2026,
in Central Park, near Bandstand.*

Winter Park, FL – January 5, 2026 – The William P. Duval Chapter of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) is donating a Liberty Tree to the City of Winter Park for the City's America 250 Committee celebrations. The first Liberty Tree was an Elm planted in Boston around the year 1646. It became a symbol of freedom of speech. In 1765, Stamp Act protests were staged under the tree. The Sons of Liberty continued to meet there to plan protests to the presence of British troops. In retribution, Boston Loyalists and British soldiers cut down the stately elm tree and burned it, in 1775. The Winter Park Liberty Tree will be a mature live oak and feature a bronze plaque honoring the history of the Liberty Tree and its significance in American History. It will be located on the path at the north end of the park where residents and visitors will have the opportunity to learn of this historic symbol of American Independence. The Dedication ceremony will be held on Florida's Arbor Day, Friday January 16 at 11am, featuring the Junior ROTC Color Guard and the Winter Park High School Brass Quintet. City Officials, DAR State and local officers, and DAR members will attend the dedication.

This event is open to the public. The Liberty Tree dedication is the first of many 2026 events, between January and July, planned by the City of Winter Park America 250 Committee, with contributions from the William P.
