Winter Park storm information

YARD DEBRIS INFORMATION UPDATE #4

Friday, October 25, 2024



City of Winter Park staff and Waste Pro® crews have been working together to collect yard debris since October 12. As of October 23, every street in the city has had at least one pickup of bagged, bundled or containerized debris.

Please continue to bag, bundle or containerize your debris for quicker pick up as piles of loose vegetative debris are taking longer to remove.

BAGGED, CONTAINERIZED & BUNDLED YARD DEBRIS

- Waste Pro will continue picking up properly bagged, containerized and bundled debris (**not to exceed 50 lbs.**) on the following days:
 - Saturday, October 26
 - Wednesday, October 30
- Up to 15 bags/bundles/containers (3 cubic yards) of properly prepared yard debris will be picked up per household.
- If you have more than 3 cubic yards of properly prepared debris, it may not be picked up all at once in order to service as many customers as possible.
- Depending on the amount of debris and the length of time it takes for disposal at the landfill, if crews are unable to finish their scheduled routes, they will begin picking up where they left off on the next scheduled pick-up day.
- Please use the proper lawn or leaf bags for disposal.

LOOSE & LARGE TREE DEBRIS PILES



- The city is continuing to pick up loose piles of debris, however, due to limited resources and the need for specialized equipment, **loose piles are taking longer** to pick up.
- Any debris that cannot be cut to fit in a bag or container, such as large vegetative debris, please **pile separately** along the curb for crews to pick up.
- DO NOT place debris near or on trees, poles, hydrants, meters or other structures.
- DO NOT place debris in the street or block sidewalks, storm drains, manhole covers or gutters.
- No construction debris will be collected.
