### Winter Park encourages recycling of election signs

#### ELECTION SIGNS & STANDS



**WINTER PARK, FL (February 17, 2025)** The City of Winter Park's [Sustainability Division](#) is partnering again with the [League of Women Voters®](#) of [Orange County Natural Resources Committee](#) to recycle election signs generated from this year's City Commission campaign season. This recycling initiative will prevent an abundance of yard signs from going to a local landfill.

Winter Park residents are encouraged to bring their campaign signs and stands to be recycled on the following dates to the following location:

**Drop-off dates:**

Tuesday, March 11, at noon, through Tuesday, March 18, at noon.

**Location:**

Fire Station 64 at 1439 Howell Branch Road

Most political signs are made from No. 5 plastic (polypropylene), a common plastic found in hundreds of household and commercial products, such as a yogurt container. The signs will be transported to [NuCycle Energy](#) where they will be transformed from bulky discarded plastic to NuCycle's Enviro Fuelcubes and then used to generate electricity, replacing coal as a cleaner energy source.

The partnership with the League of Women Voters, City of Orlando and Orange County was first initiated during the November 2020 campaign season. The 2024 general and primary election recycling efforts resulted in over 38,000 signs being recycled, saving them from being disposed of in a local landfill.
