## Juneteenth | June 19, 2023

**WHEREAS**, on January 1, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation went into effect, declaring the enslaved people in the Confederate territory free, paving the way for the passing of the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment which formally abolished slavery in the United States of America; and

**WHEREAS**, nearly 2½ years later on June 19, 1865, Union General Gordon Granger led troops to Galveston, Texas, to announce the end of the Civil War and the institution of slavery and thousands of enslaved people in Texas were freed, making them the last to learn of their liberation; and

**WHEREAS**, June 19 is the emancipation date of those who were suffering for freedom and has been celebrated for over 150 years as the nation is still continuing to advance policies that promote equity, and right the historic wrongs to secure justice and freedom for all; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1980, Juneteenth became an official Texas state holiday, and since then 49 other states and the District of Columbia have also declared it as such; otherwise known as Emancipation Day; Congress declared Juneteenth a federal holiday in 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, *An Elegy To Rosewood*, a traveling exhibition in commemoration for the 100-year anniversary of the Rosewood Massacre, is currently on display at the Hannibal Square Heritage Center through August; and

**WHEREAS**, Juneteenth will be celebrated in the City of Winter Park on Saturday, June 17, 2023, with an event at the Winter Park Community Center hosted by the Hannibal Square Heritage Center in partnership with the city's Parks & Recreation Department.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I**, Phillip M. Anderson, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Winter Park in the state of Florida, do hereby proclaim **Monday, June 19, 2023**, as "**Juneteenth**" in Winter Park, Florida, and encourage all residents to enjoy the educational and cultural celebration and to become more aware of the significance of this celebration in African-American History and in the heritage of our city.
