Hannibal Square Heritage Center

In partnership with the City of Winter Park Community Redevelopment Agency, Crealdé School of Art operates the heritage center under a 30-year lease as a tribute to the past, present and future contributions of Winter Park's African-American community. Tour exhibitions including the historic photographs and oral histories that comprise the Heritage Collection, as well as a carefully researched, historical timeline highlighting contributions, successes and hardships of the city's African-American community from the first settlers in 1858 to the recent dramatic redevelopment of Hannibal Square. The Family History Research Library, made possible by donations from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, provides family specialists that will help you map your family's history.

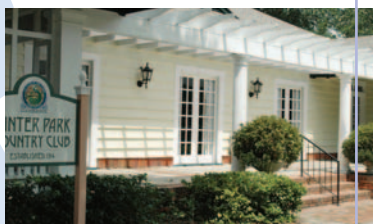

Winter Park Croquet Club

The croquet club is located at North Park and Whipple avenues in front of historic Casa Feliz. It is one of only six publicly owned croquet spaces in the United States. Members compete each Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. Membership is open to the public for \$125 per year with club providing all equipment except for the player's mallet. Reservations are required.

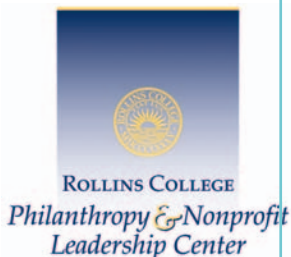
